- It's all about perfect presentation, being creative and producing great pieces of work. You can pick which tasks you do.
- Read through all of the tasks- as some you may need to gather resources for
- We will be working on this for the whole half term..... I would expect you to complete at least 7 tasks in this time.
- If you don't finish a task today it's fine, you can finish it next week
- All work should be completed on plain/lined paper and then neatly stuck into your topic book
- First 3 weeks- focus on tasks 1-6
- If you are unsure of some of the other tasks it is probably just because you haven't studied that yet in class..... You will in the next couple of weeks and you can come back to the task then

<p>1. Create a front cover for your topic book. It should say 'Topic Book' and your name. By the end of the year your book will include all subjects. Be creative- show your personality in the front cover. Make it stand out. You can add to it throughout the year. CREATIVE</p>	<p>2. Page 1 should be your geography topic cover page. You can include all things about geography. The topic cover page should include the word 'Geography' and the topic title 'Development Dynamics'. Presentation is important! CREATIVE</p>	<p>3. Getting to know you create an extended piece of writing telling me about where you have been in the world. Where have you been to in England? Where was your favourite place? Which other countries have you been to? What were these places like? What did you do there? If you could go anywhere in the world where would it be and why? EXTENDED WRITING</p>	<p>4. Getting to know you..... Create a postcard (with a picture) of a place you think is really developed. Tell me all about this place and why you think it is developed. Presentation! EXTENDED WRITING/CREATIVE</p>
<p>5. Welcome to planet Earth..... Imagine an alien has just landed on Earth and you have to describe and explain what it is like here. You will need to mention inequalities in development even try to include the things you have recently been studying in geography. You will need to explain what life on earth is like for the very rich and very poor. You can include pictures and diagrams. EXTENDED WRITING</p>	<p>6. Getting to know you..... Interview everyone in your class and find out where their possessions (E.g. pencil case, school bag, blazer) are from. Neatly label this all onto a world map. Label on the persons name and the equipment and shade in the country they are connected to. Use the map in your contact book to help you. Ask your teacher for a blank map of the world. Create a teaching aid to explain how inequality is caused by ONE of the following factors: - Physical environment - History, especially colonialism - Political and economic policies - Social investment You are allowed 10 words (not counting the title). You can use as many pictures, numbers and diagrams as you like. CREATIVE/ WRITING</p>	<p>8. Create a campaign poster to raise awareness to improve equality across the world: • Why we improve equality? • The different reasons why the equality is so important to both rich and poor. • Why inequality exists • What people can do to help CREATIVE</p>

<p>9. Using the lyrics to the Band Aid “Do they know its Christmas” Create a campaign song to raise awareness of unequal development.. Write out your lyrics and present them neatly..... Let Miss Smith know once you have completed this and she will arrange for you to record your song. MUSIC</p>	<p>10. Create a Slum in a box! Ideally this would work best in a shoe box. You will need card, coloured paper and other arts and crafts materials. If you want to do this task make sure you bring in the materials you need or let Miss Smith know if you need something specific. Make sure you include the type of housing and business that would be in a slum. Think India Mumbai! CREATIVE</p>	<p>11. Create a set of Pokemon/top trump cards for countries around the world. Use the atlas and the example cards to create your own development cards. Include the flag, income per person and the fairness score. You can battle them against other people and then stick them into your book. Ask for a template sheet NUMERACY/CREATIVE</p>	<p>12. Create your own solutions to the issues associated with rapid urban growth. Think about issues like: - Air pollution - Transport - Housing - Water shortages How could these overpopulation issues be solved? CREATIVE</p>
<p>13. Use http://www.gapminder.org/tools/bubbles as well as other sources to investigate one of the countries you have looked at today. Decide how developed the country is using the terms we have looked at today. Present your findings in a report including pictures and evidence. Use class notes to research a specific case study for one of the causes of inequality.
