SESSION DESCRIPTION

Students will experience an exciting opportunity to create, design and enter a number of live competitions. We will look at the Art World and see what current competitions are out there. Whether it is designing the logo for Google or creating a bag for the Design Museum, we will see what we can enter to help you experience the full design process from receiving a brief to meeting the deadline.



You will experience many creative techniques while competing against others to get your designs recognised and to express yourself creatively. While doing this, we will enter your creative work into the Arts Award programme so that you can gain a qualification from the experience. Many of these types of competitions allows you to become involved in the community and create outcomes which all can benefit from and enjoy.

ARTS AWARD (Drama)



SESSION DESCRIPTION

The sessions will include a variety of Performing Arts activities surrounding Drama. Students will get the opportunity to create and perform work to their peers, gain insight into the world of theatre and how a show is made. Students can present their findings through the medium of performances and written worksheets, which can be collated as evidence toward their Arts Award.



Through progressing through the five levels, young people get to: discover the enjoyment of creating and participating in arts activities & experience arts events, develop creative and communication skills that are essential for success in 21st century life, explore the work of artists and craftspeople and gain insights into the professional arts world, gain experience and knowledge to help progress into further education and employment.

ARTS AWARD (MUSIC)



SESSION DESCRIPTION

Through participating in music enrichment students will have the opportunity to perform music and create their own music. Through the initial sessions, students will explore how music technology can be used to create music and how to play a variety of instruments. As students' progress through the term they will specialise in a particular area they have found most interesting and develop their skills in this area.



This may result in students forming a band with other students, students developing a repertoire of solo pieces on a particular instrument or creating their own music using music sequencing software.

MAGISTRATES COMPETITION



SESSION DESCRIPTION

Preparation and eventual participation of the Bromley Magistrates Court Competition- in conjunction with the Citizenship Foundation. All participants that take part receive a Citizenship Foundation Certificate. There is also a chance to enter in for regional and national rounds competitions as the sessions progress.



Programme will begin with a basic overview of the legal system- legal representation and the role of prosecution and defence. Teams will eventually receive previous cases which they in which they will form teams and will practice competing against each other during the sessions. Eventually we will invite schools from the E21C Trust to compete against our teams. Once Citizenship Foundation publishes their 2020 case- we shall begin preparation upon this.
